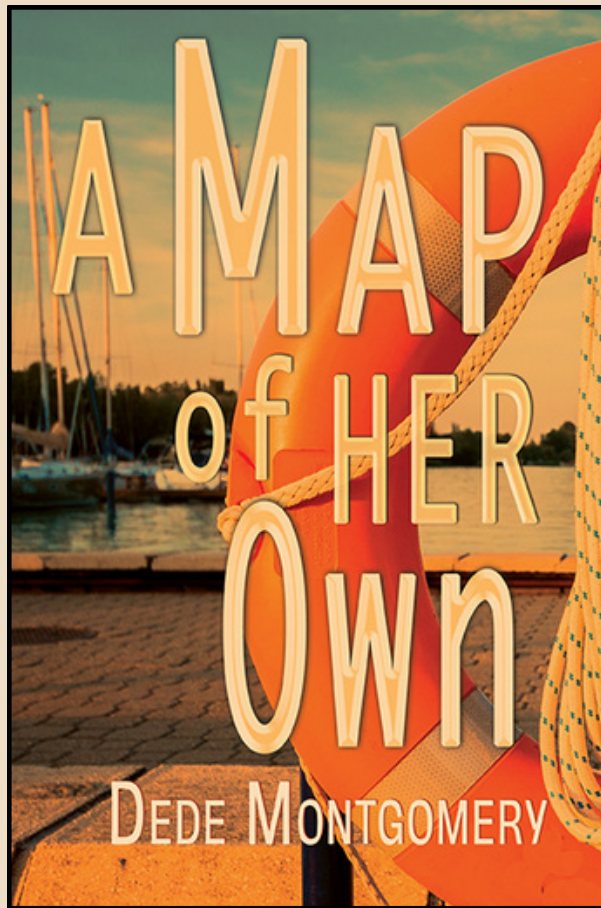

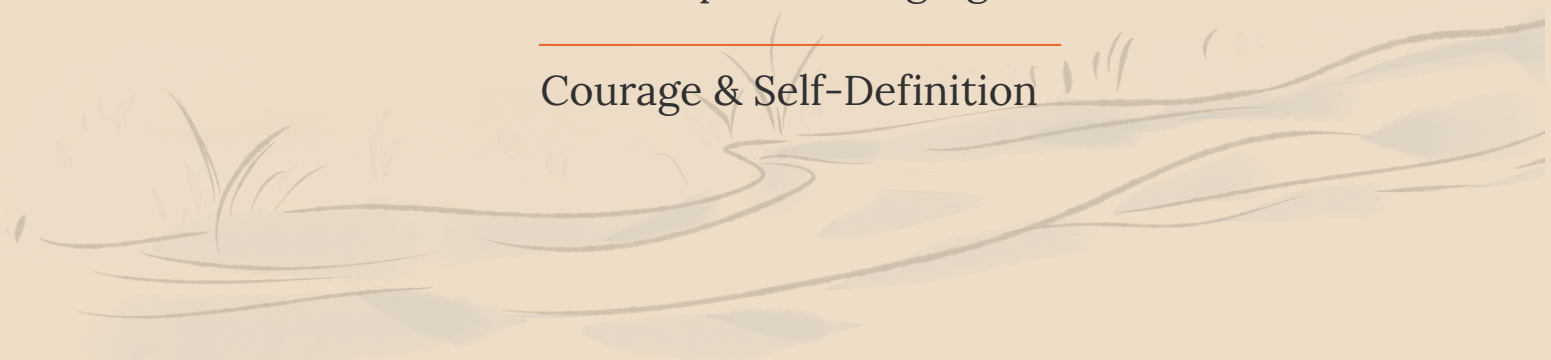

Purpose & Identity

Celia and Emma both question their sense of purpose and relevance.
In what ways did you see yourself reflected in their search for meaning?

Sense of Place

The Columbia River and the landscapes of Astoria and Camas shape the novel.
How did the setting influence the emotional tone of the story?

Women in Traditionally Male Work

Both central characters work in male-dominated industries.
Did their experiences feel authentic and grounded? What moments stood out to you?

Women's Relationships

The novel portrays mothers, mentors, and generational influence.
What insights did you take away about motherhood, friendship, and inherited strength?

Resolution & Reflection

By the final pages: Did the characters find closure, or does their journey feel ongoing? What lingered with you after finishing the book?

Dual Timelines

The story unfolds across two eras.
Were you drawn more strongly to one timeline? Why?
